

Eliminate or Significantly Reduce Development of the Naples Property on the Gaviota Coast

A development of 54 to 72 estate sized residences and associated structures is proposed for the Naples property on the Gaviota Coast. This development will bring unprecedented urbanization to the rural Gaviota Coast.

We the undersigned desire that the Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors formulate and enact public policies that preserve the rural character of the Gaviota Coast at Naples.

We request that the Supervisors establish an effective Transfer of Development Rights program to relocate potential development at Naples to appropriate urban areas in Santa Barbara County.

If it is not possible to transfer all development from the Naples property, we urge the Supervisors to constrain the residual development at Naples in the following manner.

- No residential development shall occur on the coastal bluffs or the ocean meadows south of Highway 101.
- No development shall occur within the viewshed of Highway 101.
- Any residual residential development that might be built should be no larger than the average size, bulk, and scale of that historically constructed on the Gaviota Coast.
